Keynote Speaker: Dr JULIAN CHEN

Dr. Julian Chen is a Senior Lecturer of the Applied Linguistics/TESOL Program in the School of Education. Before joining Curtin, Julian had taught internationally (USA, Canada and Taiwan) in the areas of Teaching of English to Speakers of Other Languages (TESOL), Applied Linguistics, blended learning, technology-enhanced language teaching, and 3D virtual learning.

1st Session

'Teach outside the box': A standards-based, performance-driven, culture-oriented, real-world approach

Planning a unit of work can be overwhelming for teachers considering the amount of boxes there are to tick: Curriculum standards, language learning methodologies, age appropriateness, use of ICT, authenticity of learning and intercultural elements to name a few. This talk will open the audience's eyes to how language teachers around the world create lessons and instructional designers develop curricula in the 21st century. Different from the traditional lesson planning or conventional curriculum design, we will intellectually challenge French teachers to step outside their comfort zone and get inspired by an innovative approach that follows evidence-based standards and pedagogy-sound principles.

2nd Session

Applications of Task-based Language Teaching (TBLT) in World Language Classes: Principles and Best Practices

Task-based Language Teaching, also known as task-based instruction (TBI), uses tasks as the core unit of instruction, so that students engage in activities that are authentic and involve real and meaningful communication exchanges. Bridging theory and practice, this hands-on workshop will walk teachers and professionals through the implementation of task-based language teaching (TBLT) in language classes using a backwards design. Drawing upon previous TBLT research (e.g., Long, 1985; Willis, 1998), we will first define what a "task" is and further discuss the principles of TBLT and key concepts that need to be considered when adopting TBLT in a language class (Nunan, 1991).

Workshops

Christine Tolefe - Assessment for Learning: a variety of formative assessment strategies based on real experiences in the classroom designed to improve students' learning outcomes

This workshop will help you reflect on how you can improve your students' learning outcomes by better understanding their progress and their level of understanding during a lesson.

The one-hour hands-on workshop is tailored to offer teachers a variety of strategies based on real experiences in the classroom. These strategies have been designed in such a way that teachers will be able to incorporate them in their classroom the next day.

Carolyn Vinton – Recycling unit joint with French and Art.
